

## St Mary's C of E Primary School Curriculum Newsletter

**YEAR GROUP:** One and Two

**TERM:** Autumn 1 2023

**Number of weeks:** Seven

**Topic:** Our Journey

### Overview

We meet two characters this half term. One is on a journey through the woods to deliver essentials to her grandmother. The other is a rare beast who is very lonely and travels on a journey to find friends only to discover that they were at home all along! We follow these character's journeys as they travel through trees, mountains, streams and even the ocean!

This geography themed topic will give us the skills needed to use and make our own maps and explore our locality.

### Develop: English

All children will have daily phonics lessons following the RWI phonics programme. We will be exploring narrative writing using the texts Little Red Riding Hood and The Lonely Beast. Both of these texts focus on journeys taken by the characters.

### Science

The best shoes for the job - We will be investigating which shoes would be best for Little Red Riding Hood when walking through the woods. We will be thinking about the terrain and the type of shoe sole needed. We will be making predictions and recording our findings in a variety of ways.

### Art and Design

Fruit and self-portraits - an interesting combination!  
In Art we will be studying the artist Giuseppe Arcimboldo who was famous for creating self-portraits composed of fruit. We will be looking closely at different sketching techniques and how to use the form of fruit to create a face.

### Geography

Our Geography this half term will focus on maps. We will be designing maps for familiar journeys and the journey Little Red Riding Hood would have taken to Grandma's house.

We will be looking at compass directions and describing the journeys through landmarks and physical features.

During our Oliver Bear travels we will also be looking at continents, countries, capital cities and seas.

### PSHE

This half terms Jigsaw unit is 'Being Me in My World' where we will be learning about our hopes and fears for the year ahead, rights and responsibilities, rewards and consequences and designing our own learning charter.

**Express** As expert 'magical mappers', we will share our maps with the class. We will be presenting our maps to Farrant Class, and using our knowledge to explain to them what maps need and describing the journey Little Red would take to get to Grandma's house. Our maps will be displayed for the school community to see outside our classroom. We warmly invite parents, grandparent, family and friends to our 'Book Look' on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> October 2.50-3.10 to see all our topic work from this half term.

### Maths:

Our main focus for this half term will be Place Value, Addition and Subtraction.

We will be making numbers using different representations and resources. Using numberlines and comparing and ordering numbers. We will be learning about odd and even numbers and finding lots of patterns.

As well as focussed learning sessions, the children will be exploring and learning independently, demonstrating what they have mastered in maths.

**ICT:** This half term we will be focussing on internet safety. We will be thinking about how to keep ourselves safe when online and the information that we share with others. Please use your login to explore this resource at home.
